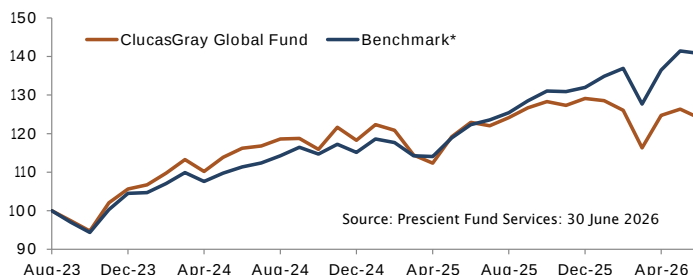



FUND OBJECTIVE & STRATEGY

The investment objective of the Fund is to provide long term capital appreciation and income growth through investment in a concentrated portfolio of assets. The fund is primarily exposed to a focused portfolio of developed market equities. The fund is managed on the basis of the long term ownership of assets and has a bias towards high quality ideas. Investors with a time horizon of three to five years are ideally suited to this fund.

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QUARTERLY COMMENTARY

The ClucasGray Global Fund declined 1.8% in June, while the Morningstar Aggressive Allocation peer group fell 0.5%. For the second quarter the Fund rose 6.7% versus the peer groups 10.3% gain.

Global markets rebounded sharply in the second quarter following a deep war-driven drawdown late in Q1. Geopolitical tensions eased materially in Q2, with a memorandum of understanding between the US and Iran raising expectations of a full reopening of the Strait of Hormuz. As a result, Brent crude fell from a near-\$120 per barrel peak to the low-\$70s by quarter end.

As the quarter progressed, market leadership became increasingly narrow, driven by a resurgence in the artificial intelligence (AI) trade. Semiconductors surged 58.3% in the three-month period, with memory-chip manufacturers Micron (+241.7%), SK Hynix (+220.7%) and Samsung (+95.6%) making significant contributions to overall market returns. At the end of June, just two sectors – Semiconductors and closely related Technology Hardware – made up 83% of the markets' overall gains for the year to date. These sectors are the immediate beneficiaries of extraordinary levels of capital expenditure by cloud-computing hyperscalers to build out data centre capacity, with guided capex set to reach \$700bn in aggregate in 2026. On the other hand, Software & Services (+4.5%) continued to lag, suffering a renewed sell-off in June (-14.2%) as concerns over AI disruption resurfaced. Energy (-13.6%) was the quarter's clear laggard as the oil-price dislocation unwound, while defensive sectors such as Consumer Staples (+0.7%) and Utilities (-0.7%) trailed in the risk-on environment.

The Funds' top-performing holdings over the quarter were ASML (+50.6%) and TSMC (+41.3%), prime beneficiaries of the accelerating AI investment cycle, while Alphabet (+24.3%), Schneider Electric (+23.2%) and Broadcom (+22.1%) also contributed meaningfully. The principal detractors were Intuit (-39.6%), which remained caught in the software-sector disruption narrative, and Zoetis (-39.2%), which fell sharply as macroeconomic headwinds and sharper competition weighed on quarterly sales. Healthcare-services holdings HCA Healthcare (-17.6%) and McKesson (-12.7%) also declined in a dynamic regulatory environment.

During the quarter, the Fund initiated a new position in Stryker, the global leader in robotic-assisted orthopaedic surgery, with a strong track record of delivering sector-leading growth. The Fund also added exposure to the European banking sector through an ETF, as the sector's return on equity profile has improved materially, while valuations remain attractive.

At the end of June, the Fund held underlying equity exposure of 97.2%, with 2.8% in cash.

The Fund has adhered to its investment policy. The number of participatory units at 30 June 2026 was 388 167.

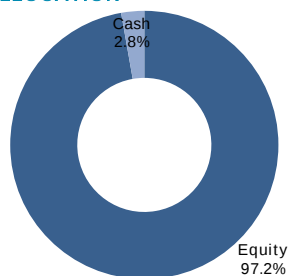
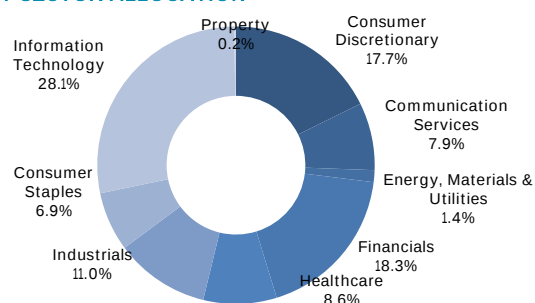
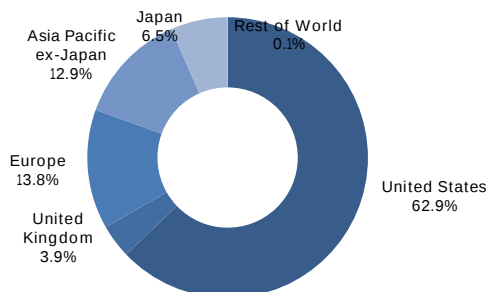

A higher TER does not necessarily imply a poor return, nor does a low TER imply a good return. The current TER cannot be regarded as an indication of future TER's. During the phase in period TER's do not include information gathered over a full year.

Transaction Costs(TC) is the percentage of the value of the Fund incurred as costs relating to the buying and selling of the Fund's underlying assets. Transaction costs are a necessary cost in administering the Fund and impacts Fund returns. It should not be considered in isolation as returns may be impacted by many other factors over time including market returns, the type of Fund, investment decisions of the investment manager and the TER.

Max Drawdown: The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.

% Positive Months: The percentage of months since inception where the Fund has delivered positive returns.
