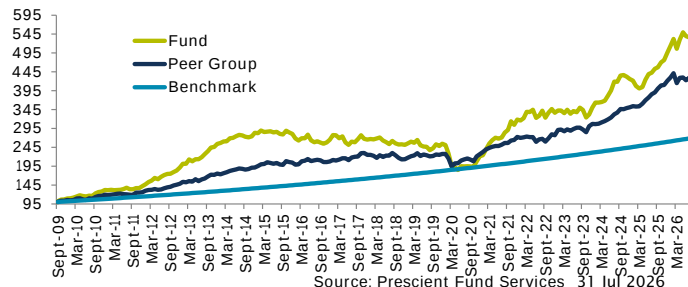


**FUND OBJECTIVE & STRATEGY**

The ClucasGray Future Titans Prescient Fund has a flexible mandate to invest in a range of asset classes but will typically have high exposure to companies outside of the Top 40 Index. The fund is permitted to invest 25% offshore plus an additional 5% in Africa. The primary objective of the fund is to achieve real long-term capital growth ahead of CPI + 6%. The fund looks to acquire fast growing, mispriced, mid-and small-cap shares, "Future Titans", on the back of high conviction fundamental investment calls. The fund has a deep value / activist bias.

WHO SHOULD INVEST

MONTHLY COMMENTARY

Within days of writing our June commentary, celebrating the opening of the Strait of Hormoz, the conflict restarted. Whilst oil markets remain relatively subdued considering the circumstances, we remain concerned with supplies of refined diesel and sulphur which impacts several of our companies.

African Rainbow Minerals announced the development of the Bokoni Platinum project planned at a cost of R15.2bn with small volumes starting in Q4 2027 and full ramp up by H1 2030. The ore body is very high grade with a steep dipping vein allowing for the introduction of a new mechanical reef cutter developed by Master Drilling. Together with the new technology Tunnel Boring machine from Master Drilling, the Bokoni Mine could be the first highly mechanised, low labour mine to showcase this technology which minimises waste rock mining which is normally needed in order for people to work in the confined spaces. Using a reef cutter to only extract the ore reduces people costs and improves the quality of the ore treated in the refining operations. Whilst this is good for shareholders in the long term, the short-term implications of R15bn in capex sent the African Rainbow Minerals share price down 10% on the day. For Master Drilling, the development of Bokoni could launch their mechanical mining technology onto the world stage.

HCI CEO Johnny Copelyn announced his planned retirement in March 2028 which lifted hopes for an unbundling of the group to unlock the c.40% discount to NAV. More importantly for HCI, Total Energies announced in their financial results that final discussions with the Namibian government are almost complete and Total had selected all the contractors for the Venus project, which would allow for first oil production in 2030. This would be a huge positive for HCI, Namibia and the Rand, which is linked to the Namibian currency.

Gold appears to have found a floor in the \$4,000 range, which is fantastic for our Pan African Resources holding. The Chinese are the big buyers as China looks for ways to mitigate the hundreds of billions in monthly trade surplus. Historically China would have used the US Dollars to buy US Treasuries but China has turned sellers of US Treasuries and instead has channelled the funds into gold. This avoids converting the cash back into Chinese Yuan which would have strengthened the currency, weakening exports and job creation. Early indications are China imported c.\$20bn of gold during the month of July 2026 to offset some of this trade surplus.

All of the developments highlighted above remain strong underpins for South Africa and the JSE, where we remain bullish on the outlook.

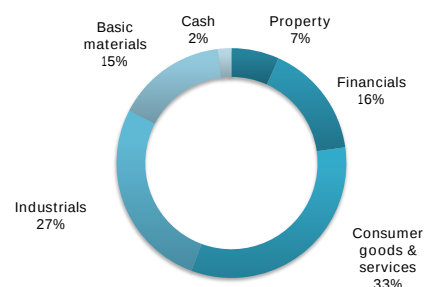
