The ClucasGray Equilibrium Prescient Fund is a Regulation 28 compliant, multi-asset high equity fund. The Fund aims to provide long term capital growth ahead of its peer group by delivering both income and capital growth in excess of inflation over time. The Fund aims to achieve these objectives through an active approach to asset allocation, and via superior stock selection. Fundamental analysis, a valuation discipline and a belief that inefficient markets create opportunities in mispriced assets underpin both our asset allocation and stock selection process.

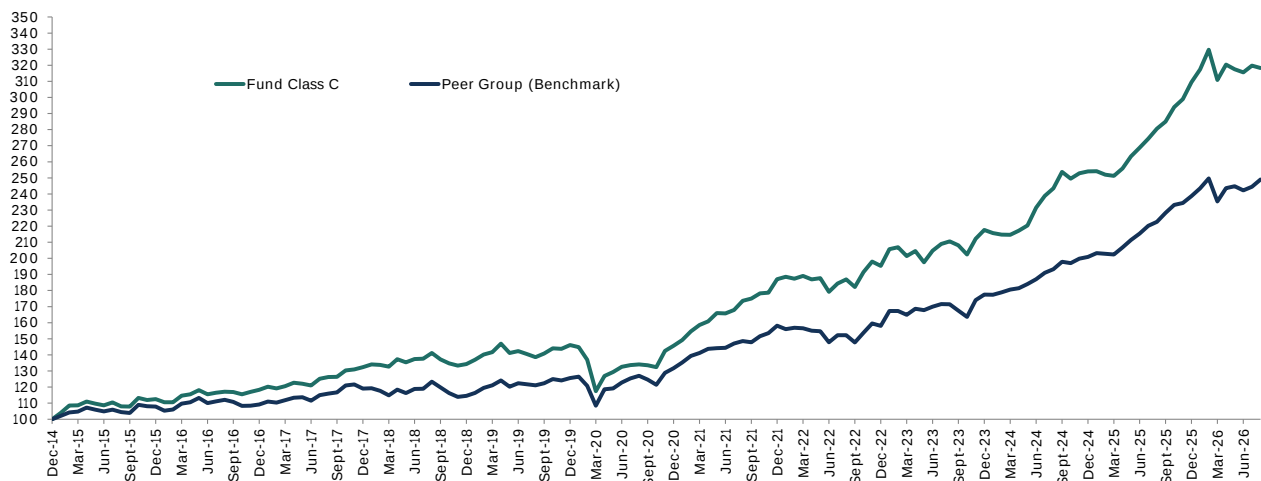

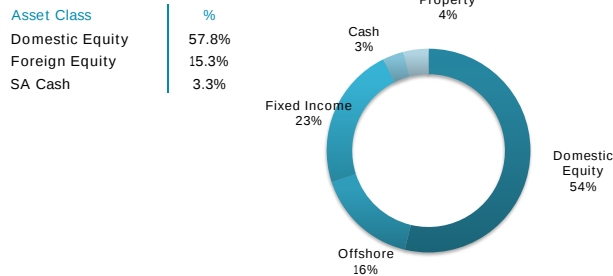

### QUARTERLY COMMENTARY | JUNE 2026

The second quarter of 2026 was another intriguing one for South African equity investors. The JSE Capped All Share Index declined by 2.4%, but it was the sector divergence that was most notable. Resources declined by 20%, whilst Financials gained 8%, Industrials 4%, with Banks and Property both gaining 10%.

Bonds delivered a strong recovery (+7.9%) in the second quarter of the year following the negative first quarter in the wake of the Middle East crisis. The ALBI is now up +4.2% for the year to date, and the 12-month rolling performance is very still very strong at +21.4%. The ALBI has now outperformed the All Share Index over the last 12 months, and the 3-year annualised returns from the ALBI of 17.8% match that of the All Share Index. Inflation linked bonds have continued to be resilient, rising 6.5% for the quarter and are up 5.3% for the year to date.

Global equity continued to perform strongly, driven by a relatively narrow grouping of companies. The MSCI World delivered a return of 13% in Dollars, notably outperforming the JSE over the last quarter. Over the last 1, 3 and 5 year periods, the JSE has outperformed the MSCI World in Dollars.

Against this backdrop the ClucasGray Equilibrium Prescient Fund delivered a return of 1.7% in the quarter. The fund is up 17.4% over the last 1 year, 14.5% pa over the last 3 years, and now over 10% pa since its inception over 11 years ago. These returns compare favourably against inflation and the peers over all periods.

Given the extent of relative market movements during the quarter, we have been active in recycling the equity holdings within the portfolio. We introduced two new holdings into the portfolio, namely Kumba and Mondi. We added to several existing holdings including Naspers, Absa, Glencore, Pick n Pay, Reinet, The Kal Group, Truworths, Nedbank and Old Mutual. These purchases were principally funded by what we deemed to be "beneficiaries" of the Iran war – companies which were beneficiaries of strong relative price movements. The sales included Anglo (exit), Sasol, Exxaro, AECL, ARI and Valtterra.

The Fund has adhered to its policy objective.
